The bats here are a mix of Natterer's and Pipistrelle, they use the south aisle door for access to the church and can be seen resting in the crack between doorframe and wall. Roosting around nave edges with droppings down nave walls and some in the body of the church.



What We Did

We have put the church in touch with their local Bat Group who may be able to help with continued bat surveys.

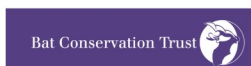
The church has attended cleaning workshops and been provided with a new cleaning kit to help maintain the church.
